If fire table is stored indoors—remove Propane Tank.

Read and follow all instructions and warnings in this Owner's Manual thoroughly before installing, operating, or servicing this fire table.

WARNING:

Improper installation, use, maintenance, adjustment or storage can cause fire or explosion, resulting in serious injury or property damage.

Prepare for use:

Keep away from Combustible/Flammable Items •

- Do not put any other fireplace cover or anything flammable on or beneath fire table.
- Combustible materials should never be within 1.83 m/6 ft of the top, 1.22 m/4 ft of back or sides of fire table.
- · For use on noncombustible floor material only.
- Keep fire table area clear and free from combustible materials, gasoline, and other flammable vapors and liquids.

Inspect for leaks, wear and damage

- Open Door and check for gas leaks before use See page 8, Step #8 for instructions on how to check for gas leaks.
- · Inspect burner and hose before use Replace if there is evidence of excessive abrasion, wear, or damage.
- · Inspect hose before each use. Hose assembly must be replaced prior to use if there is evidence of excessive abrasion or wear or if hose is damaged. Use a manufacturer-specified replacement hose only.

Prepare area, ensure proper use of fire table cover

- · Make sure ventilation openings on sides of fire table (BODY) are open and clear of debris.
- · If you have a nylon fire table cover, Do not lay cover over fire table for at least 4 hours after it is turned OFF and has completely cooled down.
- Do not use fire table if any part has been under water, Immediately call a qualified service technician to inspect fire table and to replace any part of the control system and any gas control that has been under water.

When in use:

Do's

• Use propane cylinders with the following required measurements only: 30.5 cm/12 in (diameter) x 45.7 cm/18 in (tall) with capacity 9 kg/19.84 lbs.).

If flame goes out while operating, turn gas valve OFF. Wait five minutes before attempting to relight.

- · Due to high surface temperatures always keep a safe distance to avoid burning or clothes catching fire.
- · Keep fuel supply hose away from any heated surfaces.

Don't's

- Never lean over the open fire table or place hands or fingers on the upper portion while in use.
- Do not use fire table for cooking.
- Do not burn any other materials other than what is supplied with and intended for use in fire table.
- · S olid fuels shall not be burned in this fire table.
- · Do not pour water into fire table.
- Do not move fire table while in operation.
- fire table should never be operated by children. Children must be supervised when they are anywhere near fire table. • Do not rest feet on fire table.
- Do not use fire table on vehicles or boats. Always operate fire table on flat ground outdoors.

When not in use:

- Remove Battery from Ignitor when not using fire table for an extended length of time.
- Clean battery contacts and also those of the device prior to battery installation.

DANGERS AND WARNINGS

THIS PRODUCT USES PROPANE ONLY

- Use propane cylinders with the following required measurements only: 30.5 cm/12 in (diameter) x 45.7 cm/18 in (tall) with capacity 9 kg/19.84 lbs.)
- Max gas supply 28cm/11 in w.c. (2.74kpa)
- Only cylinder marked "propane" may be used.
- · If you see, smell or hear the hiss of escaping gas from the propane tank:
- 1. Turn off gas supply and get away from gas cylinder and fire table at once.
- 2. Do not attempt to correct the problem yourself.
- 3. Call your gas supplier and / or the fire department for help.
- · A dented or rusty propane cylinder may be hazardous and should be cleared by your gas supplier prior to use.
- Do not attempt to disconncet gas regulator or any gas fitting while fire table is in operation.
- T he gas pressure regulator provided with fire table must be used.
- Do not use a propane cylinder with a damaged valve and any other worn out parts.
- Transport and store empty propanecylinders carefully and properly.

Children and adults should be alerted to the hazards of high surface temperatures and should stay away to avoid burns or clothes catching fire.

- Young children should be carefully supervised when they are in the area of fire table.
- Clothing or other flammable materials should not be hung from fire table, or placed on or near fire table.

Propane-gas supply cylinder to be used must be:

- Constructed and marked in accordance with the U.S. Department of transportation (NOT) Specifications for LP-Gas Cylinders, or the Standard for Cylinders, Spheres and Tubes for Transportation fo Dangerous Goods and Commission, CAN/CSA-B339, asapplicable;
- Provided with a listed overfilling prevention device; and with a cylinder connection device compatible with the connection for the appliance

When storing fire table:

Storage of fire table indoors is permissible only if the cylinder is disconnected and removed from fire table. Cylinders must be stored outdoors

in a well-ventilated area out of reach of children. Disconnected cylinders must have threaded valve plugs tightly installed and must not be stored in a building, garage or any other enclosed area.

Turn OFF control knob and close propane cylinder valve. Turn coupling nut counterclockwise by hand only—do not use

tools to disconnect. Loosen cylinder screw beneath bottom shelf, then lift propane cylinder up and out of shelf. Place dust cap on cylinder valve outlet whenever the cylinder is not in use.

WARNING: Improper installation, adjustment, alteration, service or maintenance can cause injury or property damage. Refer to the owner's information manual provided with this appliance. For assistance or additional information consult a qualified installer, service agency or the gas supplier.

The Propane-gas supply cylinder must be disconnected when this appliance is not in use.

Any guard or other protective device removed for servicing the appliance shall be replaced prior to operating the appliance.

Installation and repair should be done by a qualified service person. The appliance should be inspected before use and at least annually

by a qualified service person. More frequent cleaning may be required as necessary. It is imperative that the control compartment, burners, and circulating air passageways of the appliance are kept clean.

PREPARATION FOR ASSEMBLY


Before beginning assembly of fire table, make sure all parts are present. Compare parts with package contents list. If any part is missing or damaged, do not attempt to assemble fire table.

Estimated Assembly Time: 10 minutes

NOTE: You must follow all steps to properly assemble fire table. Make sure the gas valve is turned OFF before assembling. Do not attempt to assemble without proper tools.








This fire pit requires air flow under the unit. Do not place on uneven surface or on grass, turf or carpet.

 $\boldsymbol{2}$ Turn door knob, Remove door (C) and $\mbox{Lid}(\mbox{N})$.




3 Place propane tank (not included) in the metal stand inside Body (B) and make sure the gas tank sits on the metal stand completely. Turn the wing screw on the outer part of metal stand clockwise to secure the gas tank tightly.


ASSEMBLY INSTRUCTIONS

Turn Cylinder Valve on the top of Propane Tank clockwise to close off gas supply. Screw Regulator Coupling clockwiseby hand only. Make sure it is


fastened. See Figure 4




 $\boldsymbol{5}$ Replace Door (C) onto Body (B) and turn door knob to secure .



6 To install Battery (H), unscrew rubber cap of Electric Igniter (K) and place Battery (H) into the Battery Case. Make sure the positive pole ("+") faces out towards Cap. Screw Cap back to Battery Case tightly.






ASSEMBLY INSTRUCTIONS

- 7 a) Place Fire Glass (F) evenly in Fire Bowl (A). Use caution when handling Fire Glass as it is sharp. See Figure 7a
 - b) Do not place any Fire Glass over the Screen. See figure 7b
 - c) Completely cover the entire Burner Ring with Fire Glass. See figure 7c

Failure to completely cover the Burner Ring with the Fire Glass will cause flame to extinguish occasionally.








Keep Fire Glass and other objects off of screen (shown at left). Holes in the Screen must be exposed in order to allow gas to escape.

Blocked screen can cause gas to build inside fire pit and ultimately cause an explosion and risk of serious injury.




8 Before using fire table, check for gas leaks.

Perform leak test in a well-ventilated area outside and where no source of spark can occur.

- a) After opening door for access, open Tank Valve fully (counter-clockwise).
- b) Turn Control Knob to the OFF position.
- c) Apply soapy water solution (3 drops dish detergent plus 4 oz. water) to check all connections for leaks before attempting to light fire table.
- d) Coat soapy water onto all connections (shown in figure at right, 1, 2, 3, 4, 5). See Figure 8
- e) Turn Control Knob to the ON position. If there are any leaks, soapy water will bubble where leak is occurring.

If a leak is found, turn Tank Valve off and do not use fire table until repairs are made.



OPERATING INSTRUCTIONS

Before each use, open the door to inspect hose. Replace hose if there are any signs of cutting, wear or abrasion.

Caution: Only use pressure regulator and hose assembly supplied with fire table

Replacement pressure regulator and hose assemblies must be specified or supplied by manufacturer.

To Light

- 1. Turn Cylinder Valve on top of Propane Tank counterclockwise to open gas supply.
- 2. Close Door on body of fire table.
- 3. To ignite burner ring: See figure 9
 - a) Press and hold Electric Igniter button (a).
 - b) At the same time, push in and turn Control Knob (b) counterclockwise, to LOW position.
 - c) Keep the Control Knob (b) pushed in to light the burner ring.

WARNING! If ignition does NOT immediately occur

- Release Electric Igniter Button (a) and turn Control Knob to OFF (clockwise).
- WAIT 5 MINUTES to clear out the gas!
- Repeat lighting instrutions in Step 3.
 - 4. After ignition, release Electric Igniter Button (a).

Continue to push and hold the Control Knob for 45 seconds.

Note: Flame should be yellow/blue color.




- 1. Push and turn Control Knob clockwise to "OFF" position.
- 2. Turn cylinder valve on gas tank to close gas supply if not in use for a long time.

WARNING: Do not place lid or nylon fire table cover on top of fire table for at least 4 hours after use and until fire table has cooled.

CARE AND MAINTENANCE

- Store the fire table in a cool dry place away from direct sunlight.
- The propane tank must be disconnected and removed from the fire table before the fire table can be stored indoors.
- Make sure both the gas and the fire table are turned off before changing the battery. Please refer to the process of installing the battery (Step 6.)
- Use manufacturer approved or supplied replacement parts and accessories only. Use of unauthorized replacement parts may void the warranty.
- Please contact American Fire Glass INC at (888) 334-3473 for information on replacement hoses, ignitors, lava rock or fire glass, and regulator.
- Keep fire table free and clear from combustible materials.
- Visually inspect burner ring for blockages (spider webs, dirt, etc.). Keep fire table and clear from debris.
- After burner ring and fire table are completely cooled down, use a soft brush to get rid of mild stains, loose dirt and soil. Wipe with a soft cloth.
